Report for Rice Donation of 2012

Dear Mr. Sambonn Lek

Angkor Hospital for Children (AHC) extends its sincerest gratitude to you for your generosity. We are pleased to give you a report on the impact of your donation. Your donation has helped us to provide nutrition to patient and their families, especially those patients who were hospitalized for extended periods. We appreciate your ongoing support and would like to send you a tremendous thank for your assistance.

About Angkor Hospital for Children (AHC)

Angkor Hospital for Children (AHC) is a pediatric teaching hospital in Siem Reap, Cambodia, serving as the pediatric department of the Provincial Hospital and the healthcare facility for local and rural children. It provides outpatient, inpatient, emergency, ICU, surgical, cardiac, dental and ophthalmologic pediatric services. On average, 500- 550 children are seen at the hospital each day. The 55 inpatient beds are constantly kept busy. Thus treatment and inpatient care are accessible to everyone. The need for charitable pediatric care in northern Cambodia remains great. In 1999, 1 in 5 children died before their fifth birthday. Today the ratio has fallen to 1 in 20, but this is vastly disproportionate to the rate of 1 in 160 in more developed nations. While healthcare efforts in Cambodia have certainly evolved from emergency care into a developmental phase, the necessity for donor support has not diminished.

About AHC's Inpatient Department

Although most of the children arriving at AHC can be treated on an outpatient basis, the sicker ones will need to be admitted to the hospital for treatment.

Each month about 300 children are admitted to the Inpatient Department (IPD); here, each patient receives the most advanced care available in the country. The most common ailments screened and treated in the IPD include respiratory illnesses (such as pneumonia), dengue fever, heart conditions and complications from cases of gastroenteritis, bacterial infection, and malnutrition. In general, children who are hospitalized in the Inpatient Department will usually stay anywhere from 5 to 7 days. Although, patients suffering from chronic illness such as HIV, congenital heart disease, Hemophilia, and malnutrition may stay an average of two to four weeks.

Angkor Hospital for Children doesn't only provide the best medical care services available, we also provide basic health education to our patients and their families. This education includes, but is not limited to, information about hand-washing and general hygiene, dengue fever, and malaria. Similarly, AHC also offers vital services such as access to kitchens, pure drinking water, and nutritious food. The hospital provides food everyday to those patients and families that have traveled a long distance to the hospital, cannot afford to feed themselves while here, or are in such poor health they need to be fed only hospital-made meals. Also, patients waiting for treatment in the Outpatient Department, if they are poor and require such, receive a package of nutritious food as well. A typical food package given to patient's families contains rice, meat, vegetables, fruit, oil, and some groceries. A food package can typically make food for 3-4 people, twice a day for one day.

Once again, on behalf of all the AHC staff, patients, and their families we would like to thank you for your ongoing support. Because of your donation AHC is able to help many of the children and their families during their stays here at the hospital by providing nutrition, especially those that have long distances to see us.

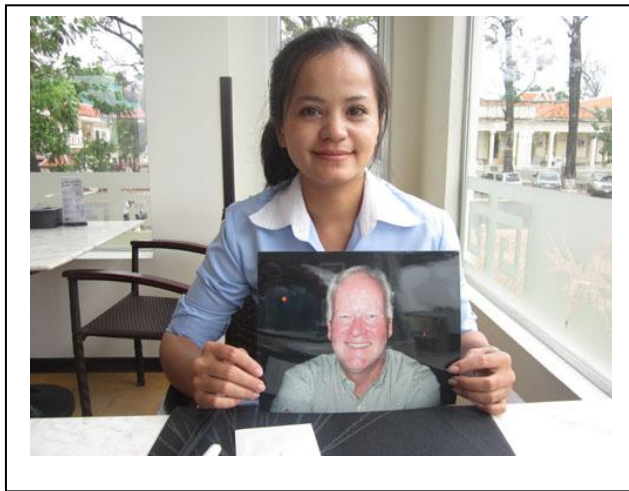

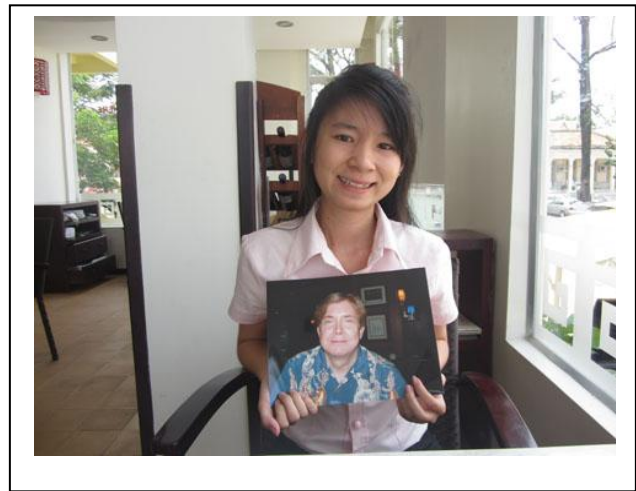

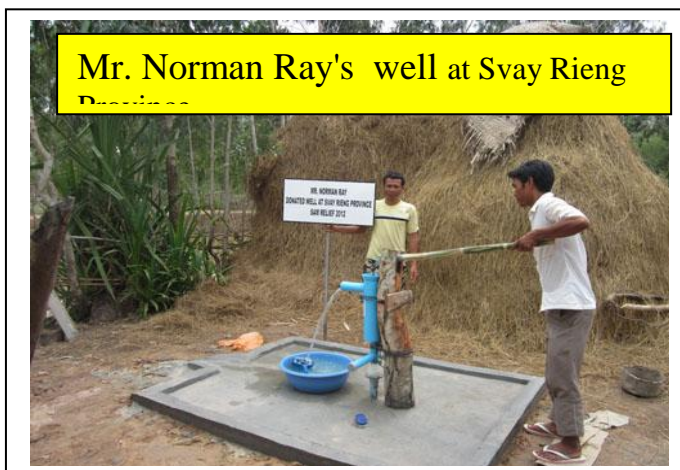
